My sabbatical in the Spring of 2021 was originally intended to focus on data collection using eyetracking to study prospective memory in children. Due to Covid restrictions, noone was allow into the daycare which rendered the testing impossible. Instead, I focused my sabbatical on developing a pedagogical approach to engaging students in eyetracking research. I worked with 8 students on proposal development and training in the eyetracking technology. We will carry out research once the daycare resumes normal operating procedures. I also committed my time during sabbatical to advocacy efforts on behalf of psychological science and the importance of research.
